"The role of cancer registries in surveillance and cancer care"

About the conference

The United Kingdom Association of Cancer Registries meets annually to discuss developments in cancer registration, the role of registry information in cancer control and relevant research.

The event was held at the RAI Exhibition and Congress Centre, which consists of 11 exhibition halls with a total covered exhibition area of some 87,000 sq.m. In addition the facility has 22 conference rooms, seven restaurants and an underground car park for over 3,000 cars.
